




Jakub Józef Orliński, the countertenor, was Young Artist of the Year. The Hong Kong Philharmonic – Orchestra of the Year, and Artist of the Year – the Icelandic pianist Víkingur Ólafsson. So it seems only sensible we should hear him right now.
